The program will position you to:

- Gain new business and organizational skills
- Create a path and plan to achieve career growth

- Better position for new, higher visibility job opportunities

What will I learn?

As part of **Leadership U for Humanity**, you will embark on a six-month learning journey, at no cost to you, focusing developing skills that will help accelerate your career.

What is included?

Through self-guided learning, live virtual classes, personal coaching, peer interactions and mentorship you will begin to better understand your leadership profile and how to activate your potential. You will learn in three phases 1) identify strengthen your leadership style, 2) develop your business skills, and 3) progress your career.

Am I qualified?

There are just a few qualifications to participate. 1) have a professional or a university degree, 2) 4 to 15 years of business experience, 3) Have a wide range of life experiences, including experiences of overcoming adversity and/or a demonstrated commitment to inclusion or community. Eligibility is not restricted on the basis of race or any other protected category. You also have the flexibility to commit to your development about 2 hours per week, during regular business hours, for 6 consecutive months. Finally, you need to be a CIS network staff member or a CIS Alumni.
